Homesickness

Our counselors, nurse, and staff are all prepared to help your camper through any homesickness issues. We will keep you informed as necessary but do not permit campers to call home.

After the first 18 hours there is no refund for campers who leave early due to homesickness. Remember that campers take their cue from you, parents. Prepare them ahead of time by encouraging them to make new friends, talk to counselors, etc. Try not to be nervous yourself, especially as you register your camper and leave him/her with his/her counselor.
