**Bart Hadder** brings a unique perspective and understanding of nonprofit viability and leadership following several years of evaluating the overall organizational health of numerous nonprofit organizations, both secular and faith based, including Christian camps and conference centers, Christian schools and other Christian ministries. Bart is an experienced and influential leader with a heart for helping individuals and organizations fulfill their God-given potential.

Bart retired from the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust in 2015, where he served as a program director, reviewing requests and managing grants. The outcome of his reviews was an analysis to determine an organization's readiness and capacity to complete and sustain a capital project or program expansion and the potential impact, thus allowing the Trustees of the Murdock Trust to make a well-informed decision regarding requests for grant support. During his time with the Trust, he worked with a wide spectrum of organizations including those with annual budgets ranging from less than a hundred thousand to several million dollars, and with staff sizes ranging from a few volunteers to over a hundred employees. Bart has also counseled many organizations on how to approach a foundation and conducted workshops at regional and national conferences on strategies for successful grant seeking.

Prior to joining the Trust, Bart had a 28-year career as a science educator, teaching at the middle school, junior high and high school levels, eventually becoming the district science coordinator for the Beaverton School District in Oregon. He began his undergraduate studies at Northwest Nazarene College, graduated from the University of Washington and holds a master's degree from Portland State University.

Currently, Bart is pursuing the opportunities God is providing to capitalize on the knowledge gained from his past experiences to help advance Christian ministries. He is also serving as a consultant, offering counsel and guidance to the Trust, grantees and other nonprofits with a special emphasis on youth organizations such as camps and schools. Bart and his wife, Jackie, recently moved to Boise, Idaho, to be near their two adult children (and mostly to be near their two young grandchildren).
