As a young child, Isaiah's family was torn apart. His parents divorced, and his father moved to West Virginia. Isaiah never saw him again. Shortly after this, Isaiah attended South Mountain Christian Camp. He couldn't afford the camp fees, but he was able to attend through the scholarship program. Isaiah loved camp and came back every year. At the age of eleven, Isaiah gave his life to Christ while attending summer camp at SMCC.

Isaiah attended camp every summer, but during his teenage years, found he wasn't as interested in a relationship with Christ. Then in the summer of 1997, at the campfire, the Holy Spirit connected with Isaiah's heart. He found himself huddled beside a tree, completely broken. He committed his life to serve Christ from that moment forward.

And serve is exactly what he did. Isaiah took part in our leadership training program and later worked as a Cabin Director. In 2008, he helped launch a new church called Element Church, and now he is on the pastoral staff there. He and his wife Kim have been married for twelve years, and they bring their kids to camp every summer!

As a child, Eve-Liina's world seemed to be falling apart. Her parents had a lot of difficulties in their marriage, which resulted in the family moving away from all her closest friends and extended family members. A kid in her new neighborhood started harassing and bullying her. There was endless fighting, and she felt completely alone.

Then her parents heard about South Mountain Christian Camp. Someone sponsored Eve-Liina to attend by providing a camper scholarship. At camp she learned that she will never be alone, and that God will always be a Father and friend. "In my lowest time, I fell into God's arms," she shares. "Now, when I look back, I remember the pain very clearly, but I would rather have felt that pain than to never get to know God."

Eve-Liina later participated in SMCC's leadership training program as a teenager, then worked three summers as a cabin leader when she was in college. Today, she is a graduate of Winthrop University!
