



SUMMER CAMP: Pricing


At Clearwater, we believe every youth should get to experience summer camp, regardless of their family's financial situation. For this reason, we use a three-tier pricing structure (shown below). Each family can decide for themselves which level suits their needs. The level you choose is completely confidential and has no impact on the quality of your child's camp experience.

Pricing shown below is representative of one week of camp. Camps shorter or longer than one week are priced proportionally to the rates listed for full-week camps.
